Playground renovations will create destination gathering spaces for generations of

community members

Delano, Minn. (July 30, 2013) — In an initiative known as Play DC, the District of Columbia's

Department of Parks and Recreation has taken on a project to renovate more than 30 playgrounds

throughout the city. Washington D.C. Mayor Vincent Gray has allocated \$35 million to the largest

playground improvement project to take place in the city.

The first of the completed playgrounds, located at Rosedale Recreation Center, celebrated its

grand opening in late May. The playground provides a fully inclusive play experience for children and

families that visit. In addition to the extensive ramping system, which makes the playstructure accessible

to those in wheelchairs, the playground also offers many sensory-rich activities including playground

climbers, slides, gliders and play panels.

The inclusive playground at Rosedale Recreation Center was also designed to mimic many of the

monuments located near the National Mall. Some of the signature design elements included are facades of

the White House, U.S. Capitol, Lincoln Memorial and Washington Monument. Plus, components with

hints of the Hirshhorn Museum, Martin Luther King Jr. Memorial, Natural History Museum, and the Air

and Space Museum were also built-in. While the site is mostly complete, the parks and recreation

department plans to install interpretive panels about each of the monumental features, which will include

a description of the monuments in English and Braille, and "push to talk" buttons to hear the same

descriptions in various languages.
